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On The Job Training (OJT)

Defined as "Hands on experience in a defined area of professional training leading to skill development"

Three types:

- Clinical rotation
- Internship/externship
- Apprenticeship


Clinical Rotation

- Short exposure to actual job
- Usually in hospital and long term care facility
- Mandated by certifying agency (CNA 30 hours)

Internship

- Work based learning
- Scope defined by educational institution and details worked with workplace
- Receiving course credits upon completion
- Most of the time unpaid
- Not longer than three months

Technical Assistance

- Safety guidelines to establish the program
- Class presentations "A day in the life of.."

Lessons learned and Win-Win-Win

- Listen to the employer needs (Grey tsunami)
- Ask questions on future roles (Sustainability)
- Invite to be part of teaching group (Share expertise)
- Follow each employer's rules (Pre admission test)
- It takes time and responsiveness (Touch base, facilitate)
- Engage students (Future jobs)

Apprenticeship

- Work based training
- Scope defined by employer and details worked with educational institution
- Could lead to certificates or degree upon completion
- Always paid "Learn while you Earn"
- Typically one year minimum

Healthcare Apprenticeship in NYS

- Governed by NYS Department of Labor
- Only three healthcare occupations
 - ✓ Direct Service Professional Competency based
 - √ Hospital Medical Coder Hybrid
 - ✓ Community Health Worker Hybrid
- Funding for employers and for trainers available

Community Health Workers (CHW) Who are they?

CHW are a vital link to promoting health and wellness in the community.

They are crucial adjuncts, an informal bridge for the integration of social and clinical work

Assist in lowering health care costs

Outreach at many levels
